

SmartVax® uses automated SMS technology to actively monitor the safety of all vaccines given in general practice and vaccination clinics in Australia



How Does It Work?

A text message will be sent 3 days after your vaccination, enquiring if you experienced a reaction. Most reactions are minor, such as low-grade fever, pain or redness at the injection site. If you experienced a reaction, respond with a simple Y for Yes or N for No. Yes responses are followed by a second message enquiring if medical attention was needed.

If you report a reaction, you will also receive an SMS containing a link to a brief, 2 minute survey that you can complete from your smart phone. The survey will gather further information regarding the nature, severity and duration of the reaction.

Remember, *immunisations* save millions of lives each year.

What is the data used for?

Data derived from this system is de-identified and may be used by immunisation providers, AusVaxSafety & Departments of Health to:

- **Conduct** rapid vaccine safety surveillance in children and adults
- Monitor & Research the safety of vaccines and changes to the immunisation schedule
- **Refine** and improve existing vaccine programs in Australia
